## Membership

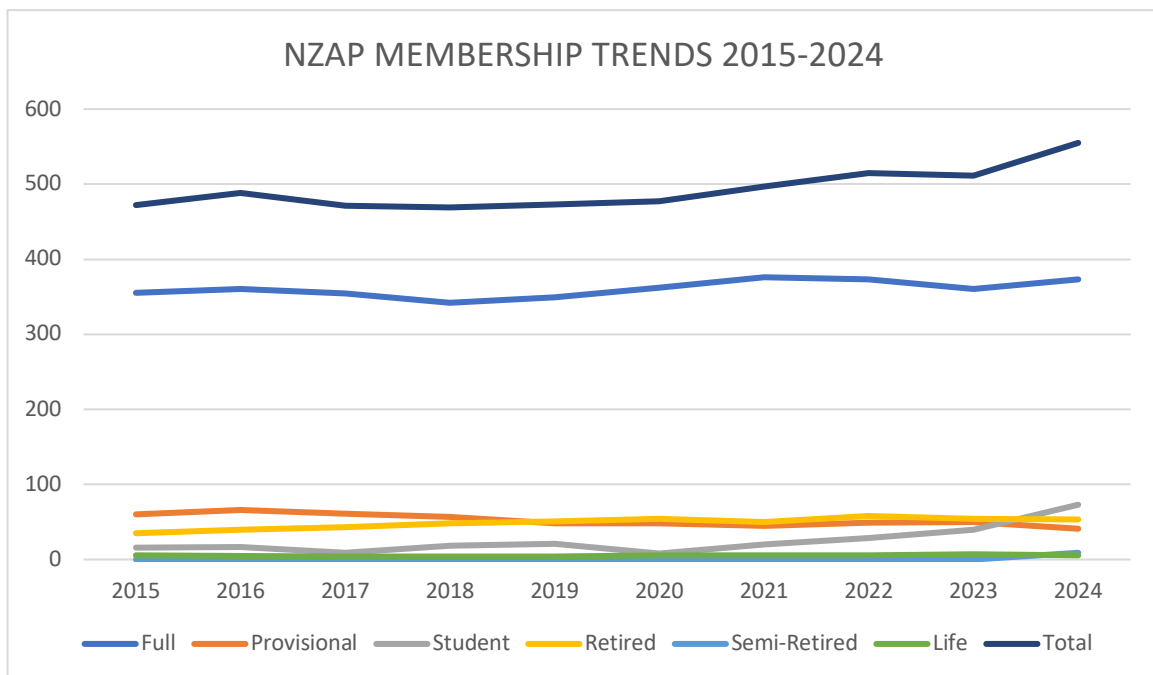
Since November, we have had 3 people sadly pass away, 15 people resign, 8 retire and have welcomed 48 new members, bringing our total membership to 555. This continues our record number of members. The student membership category continues to grow and is now our second largest group after Full members.

An overall increase of 13 members from last May.



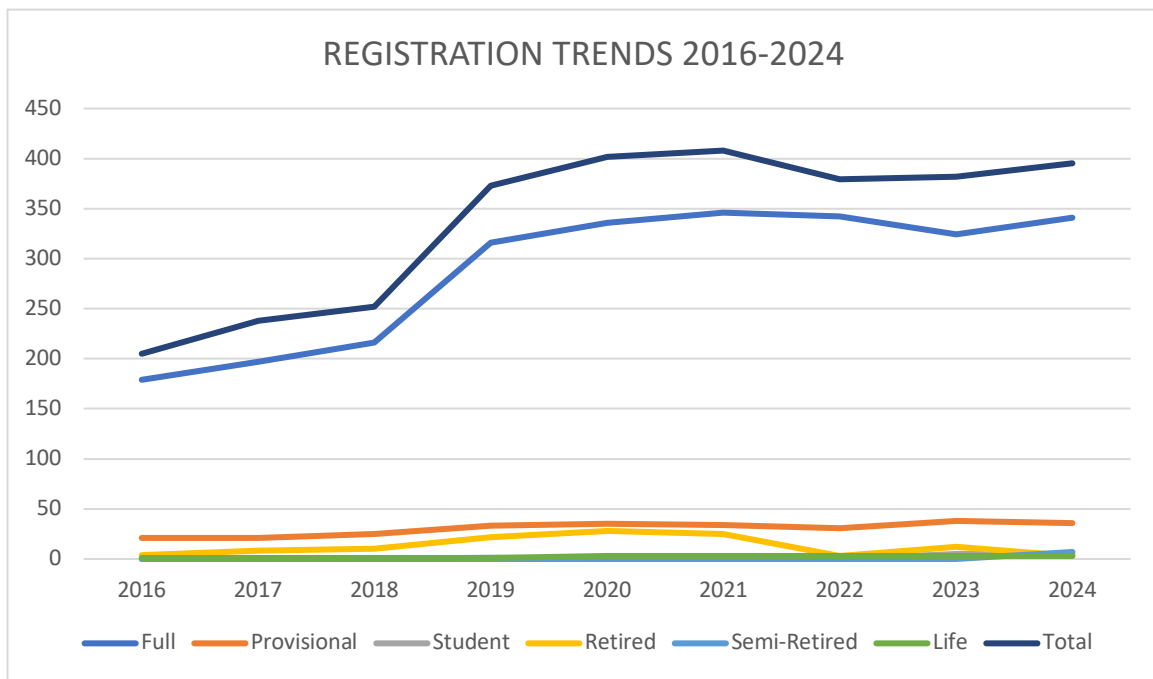

Analysis: A steady increase of registered members overall. Decrease in registered retired members.

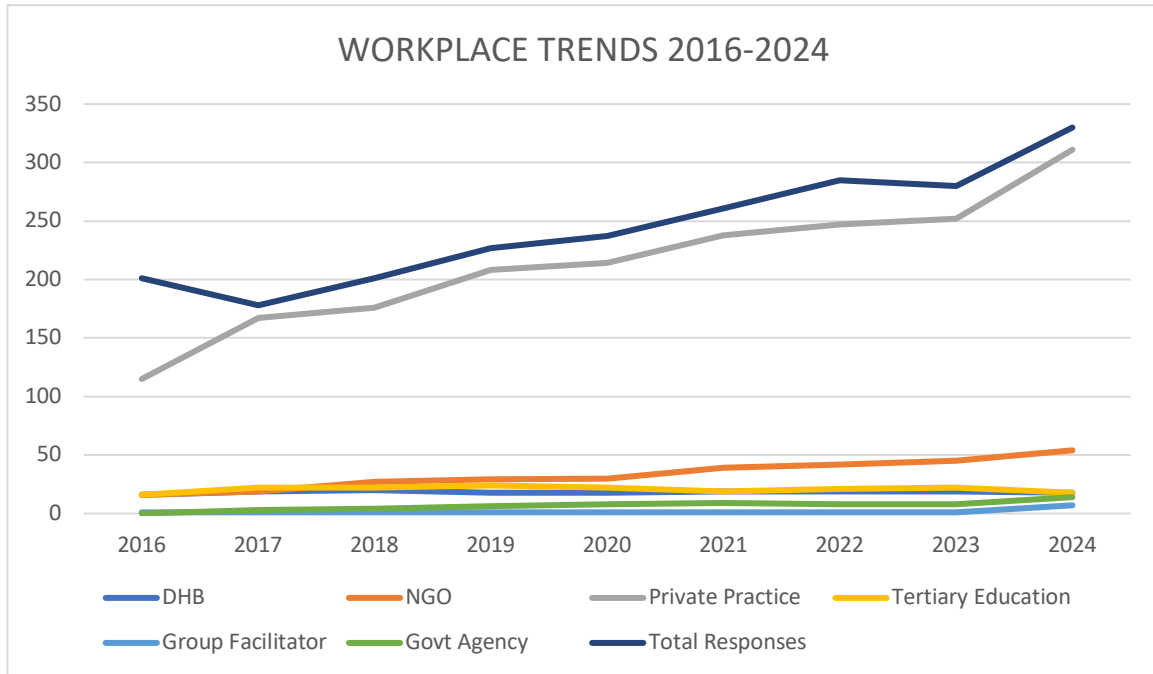

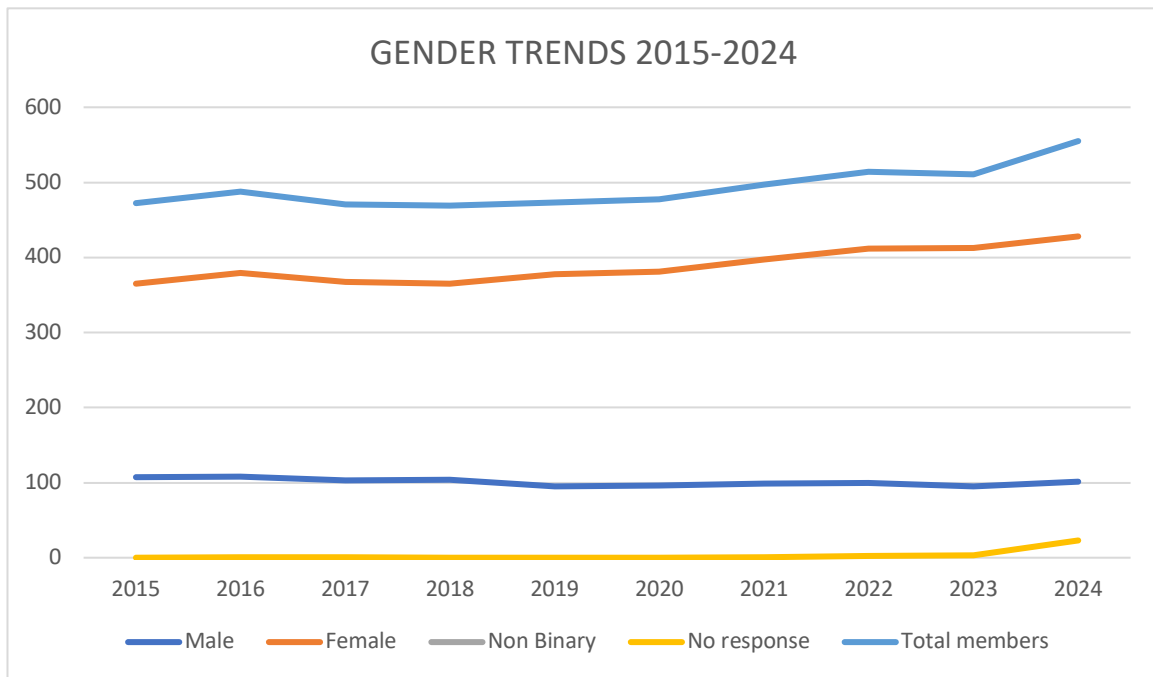

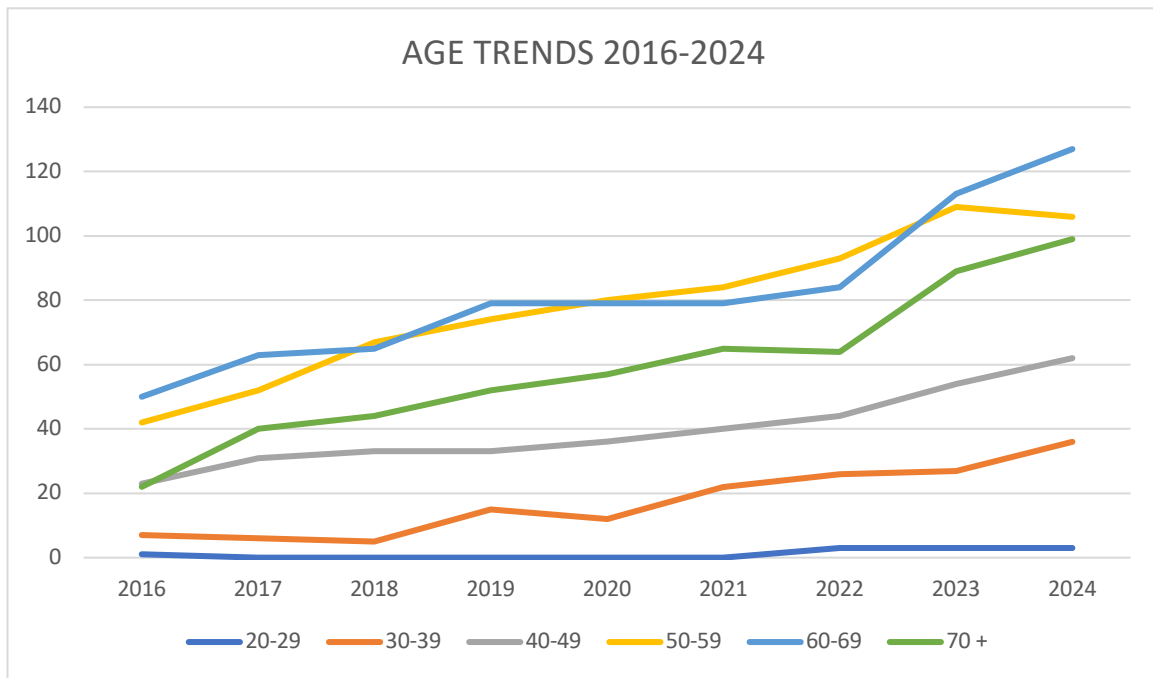

Most of our members are between 50 and 70 years old (42 %), with 18.2% being under 50, and around 17.8% being over 70 years old.



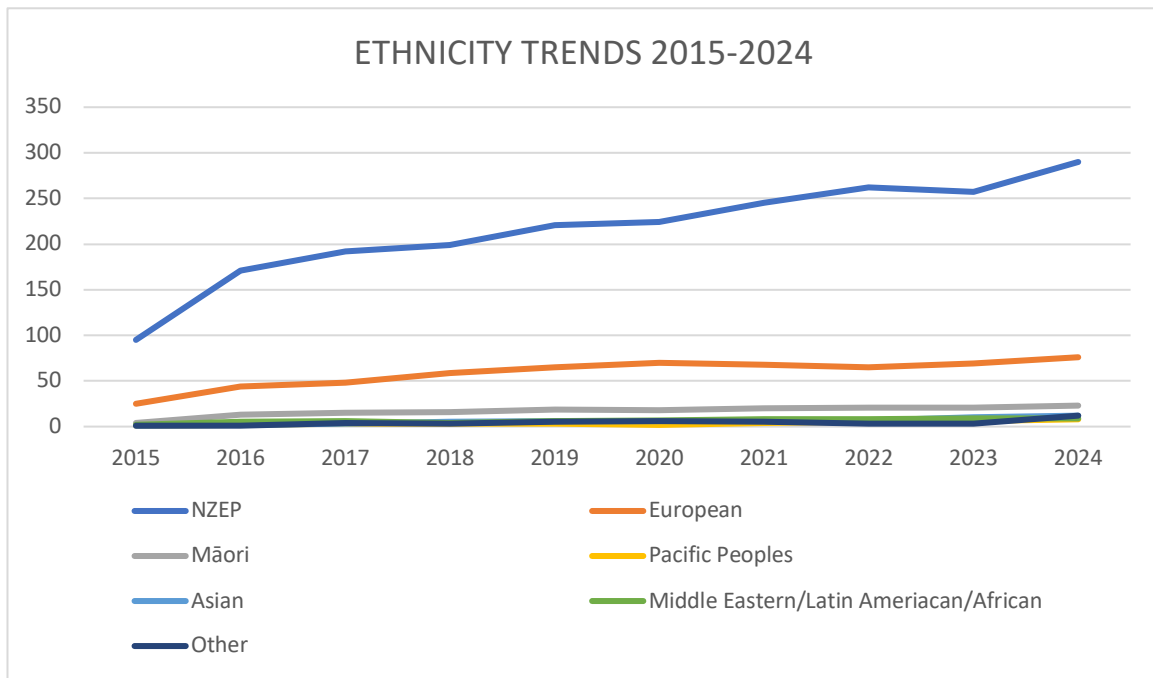
